**\*The state of Colorado no longer recognizes the validity of any permit issued by any state to a nonresident of that state (see CRS 18-12-213 amended 2007).**

**States that do not recognize any other states Permit unless there is a formal reciprocal agreement with that state:** California, Connecticut, Hawaii, Iowa, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nebraska, New Jersey, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island

**States that recognize permits for ALL states in which Permits are issued:** Arizona, Idaho, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan (\*must be resident of issuing state), Missouri, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah

**States where Carry Permits are not required:** Alaska (\*must be at least 21 yrs old) & Vermont

**States that have no right to carry statute:** Illinois & Wisconsin

**\*Please note: Right To Carry reciprocity and recognition between the various states is subject to frequent change through legislative action and regulatory interpretation. This information is the best available at the time this was written. This summary is not intended as legal advice or restatement of law but rather a guide in the right direction. It is the responsibility of all Concealed Weapons Permit holders to know and understand the applicable firearm laws of the states within which they plan to visit or venture. For information regarding firearm laws of other states, please contact the respective authority within that state. Of the states mentioned above that have formalized reciprocity or recognition with other states, there are some states that will only accept the concealed weapons permits as long as the permit holder is a resident of the issuing state.**
